Bike Barn in Boulder, Montana welcomes you

Constructed in the summer of 2017 specifically to welcome touring cyclists, the Boulder Bike Barn comes with plenty of amenities. Located on the Jefferson County fairgrounds next to Highway 69 at the south end of Boulder, it is midway between Yellowstone and Glacier National Parks. Only about 30 miles from Helena on the north and Butte to the southwest via I-15, Boulder lies at the north end of a great, scenic ride along the Boulder River on Highway 69, the perfect shortcut for cyclists heading north and south.

Inside the bike barn is a microwave, a mini-fridge, a coffee maker, counters, tables, chairs and plenty of space. A covered exterior patio is well-equipped to make outdoor relaxing and visiting easy as you enjoy the surrounding Elkhorn and Bull Mountains. Right next door is a restroom facility with showers. There is plenty of camping space for those wishing to set up a tent or just sleep under the stars. The low \$15 per night fee can be paid at the fairgrounds caretaker's mobile home close by.

Among the extras is electricity so visitors can charge cell phones. Information on area resources is also included. In town is a supermarket, several eateries with a wide array of menu items, a laundromat and hardware store.



For the adventurous seeking a back-country side trip, a twelve mile ride through the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest leads to the old mining town of Elkhorn, one of the state's best preserved ghost towns. There are also shorter loops closer to town that take in the forested beauty.
